Circular -2

Bangladesh Scouts is hosting the 32nd Asia-Pacific Regional Scout Jamboree on 11-19 December 2022 at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Industrial City, Mirsarai, Chattogram. The venue is commonly known as Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Shilpa Nagar. An approximate number of 8000 local participants, 2000 overseas participants, 1500 local and overseas IST Members are expected to take part in this prestigious Jamboree.

Basic information of the Jamboree are as follows:

Date : 11-19 December 2022

(Participants are requested to arrive on the Jamboree ground on 11 December 2022 before 5:00 pm and may depart on 19th December 2022 after breakfast. Contingent Leaders should accompany the respective contingent.

IST Members are requested to arrive on venue on 10 December 2022 before lunch and may depart on 20 December 2022 after breakfast).

Venue : Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Industrial City, Mirsarai, Chattogram

Theme : Sabash ... a fountain of energy

Participation Criteria : **Scouts:** Aged between 12-17 years (Standard Badge Holder); Scouts should be physically and mentally sound.

Unit Leaders: Minimum Wood Badge Holder

Formation of Unit : **9 Scouts and 1 Unit Leader** will form a complete Unit. In this case, Scouts from the same Unit will be considered.

Accommodation : All participating Units will be accommodated in Tents. The participants themselves will have to bring all necessary belongings suitable for camping and tent accommodation. Since the Jamboree will be held in winter season, the participants will have to bring accommodation materials good enough to protect cold wave. Ground sheets, Blankets, winter clothes, jackets/sweaters will also have to be brought with each and every participant.

JAMBOREE PROGRAMME

The participating Scouts will take part in a variety of fun activities during the nine-day Jamboree on the Jamboree grounds. The challenges will be referred to as "Elan". Elan comes from a French word meaning a feeling of strong eagerness, keenness, and vigour. 11 ELANS will enrich the Jamboree program. These Elans will be attractive, encouraging, educative, and competitive for the participating Scouts. Scouts will have to participate in all programmes of the Jamboree village-wise.

The Deputy Sub-Camp Chief (Program) will be responsible to ensure the active participation of the Jamboree participants. Scouts can collect "Elan stickers" from each activity they successfully attend from the respective ELAN Directors, Deputy Directors, and concerned Judges. By submitting all the Elan Stickers to the Deputy sub-camp chief (program), the scouts can achieve the "Jamboree Award".

The Jamboree programmes are the following:

- ELAN-02: Camp Craft
- ELAN-03: Obstacle

- ELAN-06: Hiking
- ELAN-07: Better World Framework

- ELAN-10: i-3
- ELAN-11: Campfire

ELAN-01: Dawn:

Rhythmic Aerobic Exercises, Yoga, and Jogging from one village to another will be held every morning in course of this programme. All Scout groups are to attend this programme every morning and it will help them be healthy and confident. A minimum of six Scouts from every unit must participate in the Morning Shows the Day Elan. No Scout shall refrain from this challenge more than once.

Dress Code: The Scouts should wear comfortable and exercise-friendly clothing as this Elan requires movement such as jogging, stretching, Yoga, etc.

ELAN-02: Camp Craft:

The main purpose of this venture is to make camp life enjoyable and comfortable. To make this ELAN purposeful, the participants are expected to make their makeshift residence trim and tidy with their own skill and plan. Keeping the surroundings of the camp clean by following the rules and disciplines of camp life is important. It is to mention that no electric connection and socket should be set up from the main electric line. To avoid fire, candles or mosquito coils should not be used. Jamboree Central Judge Team will initiate random visits to inspect. 03 Scouts Units from each sub-camp will receive the Jamboree Shield at the closing ceremony. The local units must carry necessary elements of these events and overseas participants will be given the camp craft elements (Bamboo and Rope) centrally as per requirements. According to the following criteria, the camp craft will be evaluated.

- a. Camp Cleanliness
- b. Gadgets (bedding gadget/ shoe gadget/ hanger/ utensils/ oven/ dustbin/ plate, glass gadget)
- c. Cooking Arrangements
- d. Innovative camp crafts

ELAN-03: Obstacle:

The obstacle is one of the most adventurous programme in this Jamboree. A minimum of six members will attend these challenges from every unit. Probable events under this ELAN are:

- Over Walls
- Monkey Bars
- Wire Crawl
- Archery
- Rock Climbing
- Vertical cargo
- Bucket Carry
- Slip Walls
- Crawl Tubes
- Inverted Wall
- Zip line- aligned with height
- Rappelling
- Valley passing
- Tire passing
- Spider Net (vertical angle)
- Jumping Puzzle
- Obstacle race
- Crawling etc.

Dress Code: clothing should be compatible for this adventure along with Sneakers/Shoes.

ELAN-04: Fun Factory:

This ELAN is a combination of Fun and Learning. There will be two parts. One is only for Fun Activities and another is Learning by Doing. In the fun part, Participants will get the opportunity to involve themselves in different activities including Archery, Shooting, Puzzle Games, Making Hawaii Mithai, Ground Zero, etc.

Through Learning by doing the scouts will have the opportunity to learn different things from daily life to increase their skills and knowledge. Different types of stalls will be decorated and opened to the scouts. They will be able to learn something from each stall and will try to do something by themselves such as:

Ø Bicycle repairing:

The participants will be shown different parts of a bicycle and will be taught to fix a bicycle. Then, the participants will be given the task of attaching and repairing different parts of a bicycle in their own group.

Ø Science project

Units are requested to bear a Science Project while coming to Jamboree Ground. On the day while they are participating in this activity they have to show their project on the ground. One Scout from each unit will describe their projects as representative. The best 24 Projects will be awarded.

Ø Editor's Functions

The scouts will know about the functions of an editor from this stall. They will come to know about report writing, editing, and news presentation in this stall. After that, their task will be to write and present a report.

Ø Plumbing

In this stall, the scouts will learn how to fix and set up a water pipe. Then they will be given the task to fix one themselves.

Ø **Craft**

In this stall, the scouts will learn how to make different craft items by using cane, thread, rope, soap, soil, and wax. The scouts will also learn how to prepare various models of boats, pens, cranes, and butterflies, etc. and they will do it themselves as well. Making a bracelet using thread, rope, and bamboo will also be displayed in this stall. The scouts will bring some soil from their camp area for making any model by soil. The models made by the scouts could be brought back by them.

Ø **Fire Fighting and Disaster Management**

In this stall, the scouts will be shown what to do when there is fire, recovery system during a disaster period and how to carry injured people. At last, the scouts will participate in a fire fighting drill.

Ø **ICT BUS**

There will be ICT buses from the Ministry of Information and Communication Technology at the campground. Participants will get the opportunity to learn about information technology and technological advancement in Bangladesh.

Ø **Translator**

The scouts will learn the job of a translator and also learn some words from different languages. They will also be provided with the guidelines for learning a foreign language.

ELAN-05: Towards the Beach:

This activity will create the opportunity to introduce our world heritage the longest sea beach in the world to all of the participants. From the 3rd day of Jamboree, one village will travel to Cox's Bazar and return to Jamboree ground on the next day by ship. During this journey, scouts have to take part in different interesting and competitive activities.

ELAN-06: Hiking:

These will be offsite activities. Scouts have to participate in this event while they are staying in the "Camp in Camp" site at Cox's Bazar. This activity will create an opportunity to introduce local culture to participants as well as visit different tourist spots. Hiking will be unit based. The scouts will practice tracking signs and use of compass before participating in hiking. Scouts will reach the destination using a field book, tracking sign, information, puzzle, and code cipher. Upon reaching the destination, the scouts have to take part in the Fun & Game Elan at the beach.

ELAN-07: Better World Framework:

Bangladesh Scouts is operating all of the initiatives of the Better World Framework. 06 different stalls such as Messengers of Peace, Scouts of the World Award, Earth Tribe, HeforShe, Dialogue for Peace, Patrimonto Scout Badge. By taking part in this Elan participants will come to know about the activities of the initiatives throughout Bangladesh and the world.

ELAN-08: Beach Games:

Beach Games is a friendly competitive activity. All of the members may participate in this event. Each game must be played as a team. Each unit will have the opportunity to play any of the 4 games selected through a lottery. Water relay, beach football, beach cricket, beach Kabaddi, beach Frisbee, Golf, Discus throwing, Kiting on the beach, and drawing/sculpting on sand will be arranged on the beach.

Besides this, the Jamboree authority will have the arrangement to try some adventure activities at nominal prices Such as Parasailing, Horse Riding, Water Scooter, Sand Scooter, and Surfing.

ELAN-09: Neighbour

During the Jamboree, a unit will receive hospitality from another unit, and at the same time Scouts will make friendships, and exchange handmade gifts. Before the beginning of this ELAN, the concerned director and a representative will inform the office of the village and sub-camp officials about the team allocation. Through this event, the scout of one place can understand the history and culture of another place. Each Unit is requested to take traditional food items of their district with them to entertain the other unit who will come as a guest.

ELAN-10: i-3

i-3 is the short form of (iii) belonging to Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure focusing on the Goal-9 of SDG. The jamboree is to be held in the area of Bangladesh Economic Zones Authority (BEZA). It aims to establish economic zones in all potential areas in Bangladesh including backward and underdeveloped regions with a view to encouraging rapid economic development through increase and diversification of industry, employment, production, and export'. Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Shilpa Nagar (BSMSN) is one of the projects under BEZA at Mirsarai, Chattagram. Potential Investment Sectors of this project are: Garments & Garment Supporting Industries, Agro-products and agro-processing products, Integrated Textiles, Leather and leather products, Shipbuilding, Motorbike Assembly, Food & Beverage, Paint & Chemical, Paper & Products, Plastics, Light engineering (including auto-parts and bicycles), Pharmaceutical products, Power, Solar Park. Jamboree participants will get the opportunity to visit one factory to know the function of the company at factory level. Participants will take part village wise in these activities.

ELAN-11: Campfire

At the end of the day's work, the campfire is an integral part with the aim of keeping the liveliness of Scouts by enjoying spontaneous pleasure. Campfire will be operated according to the conventional rules of Scouting. At first, all units will perform in their own sub-camps. Some selected units will join the village campfire. Nominated units from the village campfires will get the chance to join in the Grand Campfire. Local Participants will join the campfire unit-wise and overseas participants will join this event as a contingent.

Sub-camp-based campfire:

Sub-camp based campfire will be performed according to the fixed schedule of the jamboree. Unit-based participation will be evaluated to give stickers and performances will be finalized for the village campfire.

Village campfire

Selected contingent performances and the fixed number of performances from sub-camp competition of units will be held on the fixed day of the village-based campfire. Performances will be finalized for the exhibition in the grand campfire from here.

Central Events:

Inauguration Ceremony:

This will be one of the most colourful and fascinating events of the Jamboree. During the ceremony, scouts should gather in the main area in their proper uniforms. At least 6 scouts will have to participate in the display to beautify the Inauguration Ceremony. Only those scouts who remain present at the ceremony will participate in the display. Apart from them, some experts will also participate in the display to make the ceremony successful and grandiose

Folk Festival:

The Folk Festival is one of the beach activities. During Camp in Camp, participants will have to take part in these events contingent-wise. Each NSO has to come up with preparations for the Folk Festival to present their respective countries. Along with contingent performances, local cultural items will be presented to portray the local/ethnic culture.

Top Achiever Scouts' Gathering:

President's Scout (PS) award and President's Rover Scout (PRS) award are the highest recognition in the life of a scout respectively in Bangladesh. Members of ATAS (Association of Top Achiever Scouts) and BATAS (Association of Top Achiever's Scouts Bangladesh) may attend this grand program. Registration fees will be declared by the 3rd Jamboree Bulletin.

Wood Badger's Gathering:

Leaders involved in the Jamboree as IST (Wood Badge Bead Holder) will get the opportunity to participate in this event. Many adventurous and attractive programs will be performed to make the gathering remarkable. Wood Badger's Gathering Will be held on 14 December 2022 at 3:00 pm. Registration fees and necessary information will be shared through the 3rd Jamboree Bulletin.

Volunteers' Night

Volunteers play an important role in the successful implementation of a camp. Volunteers gathering or get together "Volunteers night" will be organized to encourage accelerating their work. Only serving rovers in the jamboree will participate in volunteers' night. Rovers will get the chance to perform dance, songs, poems, and play at volunteers' night. Those who have been associated with health, security, cafeteria, or running events during the jamboree, have to attend the volunteer's night with the permission of the respective department.

Grand Campfire

The Grand campfire will be held in coordination with national, foreign units, and contingents on the evening of the 6th day of Jamboree. The Grand campfire will be hosted by selected units and contingents from the village campfires.

Victory Night:

As part of victory day celebration activities on 16 December 2022, colorful cultural events will be arranged. In the exhibition of renowned artists from the country will perform. The main objective of the event is to introduce overseas participants to the history of Bangladesh. If any contingent wants to perform at this event they must communicate to the central events sub-committee with a video of the performance.

Free Time Activities

GDV -Global Development Village:

GDV will offer knowledge about the health, environment, and climate, of the contemporary world side by side with SDG. This changing world is constantly facing various challenges such as health, nutrition, pure water, sanitation, environment, climate change, catastrophe, child health, maternal health, HIV/Aids, various diseases, gender issues, information technology, etc. which impact our daily life. To combat this challenge, national and international, government and non-government organizations are implementing various programs. Acquiring broad ideas and knowledge on these topics, GDV will be established in coordination with various government and non-government organizations and NGOs to face future challenges in aiming to make aware scouts and common people. Scouts, participating from different countries, enriching their own knowledge and experience by visiting the stalls of GDV in the prescribed time and sharing their views can apply in their daily life. After visiting the stalls of GDV, the participants will enjoy a cultural and recreational program. In addition to participants in the jamboree, the local people will be given the opportunity to visit the GDV at the scheduled time. Each and every participant will have to visit this area during the entire jamboree period. They have to write down about the activities of the organization (at least 3) they visit in their jamboree guide. After that, they can collect seals and stickers from the GDV office.

Crossroad of Culture:

These events will create an opportunity to know about the heritage, custom and culture of the own countryside. As a host country, Bangladesh will arrange huge arrangements to represent approximately the entire heritage, culture such as Melai Jaire zone: different pitha- naru-moa, Boishakh-hemonto borsha stall, nagordola, chorki, dugdugi, gazir gan, Bioscope, sharee & lungi stall, pottery & coloring, Jewellery making, Clay Pottery Quest, Bioscope, Embroidery / Nakshi Kantha-Stitching, Ethnic Jewellery Making, Rickshaw, Thela Gari, Gorur Gari, Mehedi Stalls, Ethnic Jewellery and Cloths , Human size board games, Learning by doing : jute focus, Making musical instrument. Pitha Toiri, Nokshi Katha Design, Chakma bamboo dance, Musical room, Karaoke, Friends & Family. This will be one of the colourful and attractive arrangements for the jamboree.

If any overseas contingent wants to have their stall at this event they have to notify Jamboree Secretariat at the time of registration. Each and every participant will have to visit this area during the entire jamboree period. They have to write down about the activities of the event (at least 3) they visit in their jamboree guide. Afterward, they can collect seals and stickers from the **Crossroad Culture** control room.

Swapping

Scouts and Adult leaders can exchange their collected scarf, badge, woggle, coat pin, t-shirts, key-ring, stamps, envelopes, handmade things, etc. with scouts and adult leaders (According to SfH Guidelines) during the jamboree. For this purpose, the swapping area will be fixed in the specific area of the jamboree. However, scouts can swap with one another during the Elans. However, money and foreign currency swapping is not allowed under any condition.


